

Instructions: Surcharge Transmittal Report (Report 1)

In accordance with California Code of Regulations, Title 27, Article 5, Sections 15240 and 15250, each Certified Unified Program Agency (CUPA) shall transmit all collected state surcharge revenues to the Secretary for Environmental Protection (CalEPA) within 30 days of the end of each state fiscal quarter. Each surcharge transmittal shall separately report the amount of surcharge revenues collected in each fiscal year for the following program elements:

- CUPA Oversight, Title 27, CCR 15240 (c)(1)
- California Accidental Release Program, Title 27, CCR 15240 (c)(1)
- Electronic Reporting, HSC 25404(e)(3)
- Aboveground Petroleum Storage Act, HSC 25270 et seq.
- Underground Storage Tanks, Title 27, CCR 15240 (c)(1)

The surcharge assessments for each program element are as follows:

* The surcharge transmittal should only reflect applicable program element surcharge amounts and should not reflect remittance of any assessed late fees or other charges.

** Effective fiscal year 2009-2010, an Electronic Reporting surcharge was established to fund the California Environmental Reporting System (CERS). The Electronic Reporting surcharge was \$25.00 per year, for three years [HSC 25404(e)(3)]. CUPAs must assess and collect the Electronic Reporting surcharge from their regulated businesses for three complete billing cycles. Once collected for three complete billing cycles, the Electronic Reporting surcharge is no longer applicable.

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The information on Report 1 shall be completed as follows:

CUPA:	Enter the Certified Unified Program Agency remitting surcharges to CalEPA.			
Date Submitted:	Enter the date the surcharge transmittal is being submitted to CalEPA. Surcharges shall be remitted to CalEPA quarterly as follows:

Fiscal Year of Accrued Surcharges:	Enter the fiscal year for which remitted surcharges were accrued. Remittance of surcharges can be submitted for previous fiscal years.			
Check Number:	Enter the number of the check used for surcharge remittance.			
Completed By:	Enter the name of the person completing the Surcharge Transmittal.			
Telephone Number:	Enter the telephone number of the person completing the Surcharge Transmittal.			
Program Element Surcharge and Amount Remitted:	Enter the surcharge amount being remitted for all regulated Businesses, Facilities and/or tanks. Do not include surcharge amounts previously collected or reported. The total remitted surcharge for each program element should be calculated as follows:			
	Program Element Surcharge	X	# of regulated Businesses, or Facilities, or Tanks	=
Total:	Enter the sum of all surcharge amounts for each program element.
